




Child coal mine workers in the United States— January 1911

Your local newspaper asked three citizens selected at random to respond to the following question:

Should governments ban the use of cellphones while driving?

Citizen I



Modern lifestyles require ready communication with others at all times. No one wants to cause a traffic accident, so, as responsible citizens, people use cellphones only when traffic is light and they adjust their driving accordingly. Laws banning cellphone use are another example of government unjustifiably restricting a civil liberty that individuals should enjoy.

Citizen II



While there is no question that using a cellphone while driving is potentially dangerous, passing a law banning driving and phoning may not be the best solution. Enforcing such a ban would be expensive and next to impossible. Furthermore, cellphone use is only one of many forms of driver distraction that can potentially cause accidents. The money that would have to be spent enforcing a ban on cellphone use while driving would be better spent on education campaigns promoting safer driving in general.

Citizen III



The banning of cellphones while driving is long overdue.
